



1 The scope of plumbing work for licensed well contractors is defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 326B.46, subd. 6 and includes:

1. water service pipe from a well to a pressure tank;
2. a frost-free water hydrant with an antisiphon device on a well water service pipe located entirely outside of a building requiring potable water;
3. a control valve, located outside the building, on a well water service pipe; or
4. a main control valve located within two feet of the pressure tank on the distribution supply line.

2 This situation is rare – the facility must fully meet the definition of Agricultural Building in Minnesota Statutes, section 326B.103.

3 State-Licensed Facility: Hospitals, nursing homes, assisted living and memory care, supervised living facilities, freestanding outpatient surgical centers, correctional facilities, boarding care homes, or residential hospices and similar facilities.

4 Public Buildings (as applies to plumbing projects): Buildings owned and paid-for by the state or a state agency regardless of cost, and school district building projects or charter school building projects regardless of cost.
