By signing up, they will receive free, accessible health education videos in their own language texted directly to their phone. No identifiable information is required, and phone numbers are only used to send educational health videos.



Who is it for?

These videos are made for newcomers to the U.S. – and anyone else who wants to learn more about their health in their own language.

NEW videos are designed to be accessible regardless of language or literacy, so all can understand and use the information with confidence.

Why share this resource?

People who sign up will receive a new video every few weeks.
