What is the Pediatric Care Coordination community of practice?

The Minnesota statewide Pediatric Care Coordination community of practice (PCC-CoP) offers a valuable opportunity for care coordinators to connect, collaborate, share resources, and learn from each other. These activities build the capacity of systems that serve families of children and youth with special health needs and disabilities, improving the quality of support families receive.

Who can join the community of practice?

The Pediatric Care Coordination community of practice welcomes people who work with children and youth who want to collaborate and network with professionals across multiple disciplines. Members come from health care, education, local public health, mental health, and other systems that serve children and youth with special health needs and disabilities.

How can the community of practice benefit me professionally?

By joining the community of practice, you will have the opportunity to engage with peers, share knowledge, and access tools designed to support your work. Membership includes access to our online collaboration platform and regular updates on networking events and professional development opportunities.

Who leads the Pediatric Care Coordination community of practice?

The Pediatric Care Coordination community of practice is supported by the Systems Transformation unit at the Minnesota Department of Health and guided by a steering committee composed of representatives from state agencies; medical clinics and hospitals; local public health staff; and organizations across Minnesota. These leaders bring diverse perspectives and are committed to driving systemic change.
